Introduction

Sectors organised

- PSI focus is on the formal public sector quality public services
- Sectors cannot be separated and quality of life impacts across the whole spectrum
- Worker mobility from one sector to another
- Worker solidarity



World Class Cities for All

- SAMWU has joined forces with Streetnet on the WCC project
- Issues of street vendors in particular municipalities
- Trading sites of street vendors under threat e.g the Warwick Street in Durban



Support for domestic workers

- Organisational support for South African Domestic & Allied Workers Union
- The large component of these workers are vulnerable women
- An office for the union has been provided and union generally supported



National Gender Commission

- A dedicated project managed by the NGC
 - Recruitment of women workers in casualised sectors that should be under municipal control
 - Limited work on informal refuse recyclers
 - Women empowerment and support

General Collaboration

SAMWU has a formal cooperation agreement with Streetnet involving:

- Organisational support to their activities
- Working with Streetnet staff on particular projects e.g input on workshop on Xenophobia aimed at mainly street traders/vendors
- General partnership/solidarity in action
